10.1 Ward Councillor Graham Powell Abbeydore & Bacton GPC Ward Member Report-May 2016 "**Schools White Paper** In March government issued their white paper, Educational Excellence Everywhere, which describes the process whereby every school will either be an academy or on the route to becoming an academy by 2020.

I make no political points but there are two matters that I feel I should bring to the attention of the GPC.

The majority of maintained schools currently lease their land from local authorities, typically over a 125-year period. To speed up the process of academy conversion and ensure that land issues do not get in the way of improving schools, when a local authority's community schools convert to academy status, land held by the authority for those schools will transfer to the Secretary of State, who will then grant a lease to the academy trust.



Academies are classed as charities, who do not pay business rates. It is estimated that the conversion of all schools in Herefordshire to academies will result in a loss of income to the council of some £700k per annum.

There will naturally be discussion, debate and change before the white paper's journey through parliament but 1) impinges on the local authority's ability to sell land and recycle the income into new build and 2) comes at a time when local authorities only sources of income will be council tax and business rates.

Hereford Bypass Phase 1 of the Hereford Bypass (A49 Callow) to A465 (Clehonger) will be determined at a planning committee meeting on 6th June 2016. This application is the forerunner to the complete Hereford Bypass and has significant and positive implications for major businesses locally. Comments can be made via the HC website – application number 151314

Smallholdings A Cabinet meeting on 14th April agreed the process for the appointment of an agent to oversee the disposal of the smallholding estate. The expectation is that the agent will be appointed by July and a disposal plan will be available for Cabinet consideration in October. It is proposed that the following outcomes be taken into account by Cabinet when deciding between disposal options to be brought forward by the agent:

- Maximise financial return
- Supports the welfare of the council's tenants
- Support the local economy (including the agricultural sector)
- Minimise timescale

Community benefits

Primary School Places In Herefordshire, we have made **1,839** offers with the following parental preference success rates:

First preference: 1,742 offers, which is **94.7%** of the total offers

Second preference: 58 offers, which is **3.2%** of the total offers with a cumulative success rate of 97.9%

Third preference: 10 offers, which is **0.5%** of the total offers with a cumulative success rate of 98.4%

The remaining 29 or 1.6% of places offered were to parents whose preferences could not be met and their offer was for the nearest school to their home address with available spaces.

As in previous years, Herefordshire schools are a net importer of pupils, with more pupils from neighbouring counties requesting places in the county's schools than Herefordshire pupils requesting places in neighbouring counties.

There are currently 17 primary schools in Herefordshire with waiting lists and 53 have available spaces.

This year, the council promoted a new online application service, which it was hoped would account for approximately 50% of applications. It was actually used by 86% of families.

Lengthsman Scheme 2017/18

Mobile Infrastructure, east of Clodock The new mobile mast, to the east of Clodock, has now completed the construction stage and the Mobile Network Operators have installed and commissioned their equipment. EE and 3 are in service but I do not have a firm in service date for Vodafone or 02 at this time.

Broadband An open market review for the Lot 2 area, as described in the Fastershire Broadband Strategy (an area that includes Abbeydore & Bacton) has concluded that there will be no commercial deployment in the area. There has also be an "industry day" to inform potential bidders of the requirement and respond to questions. The next stage is to issue an open tender. "

Golden Valley Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT) Briefing 5th - 18th April 2016 Crime Trends

<u>Craswall</u> A bright green Kawasaki 85 scrambler bike was stolen from a farm building overnight on Thursday 14th and Friday 15th April Incident ref 298-s-180416

Ewyas Harold The BT pay phone set in the kiosk at the side of the fish and chip shop was broken into at around 03:01 hours on Saturday 9th March, 2016. The offenders prised the cash box section from the device off the wall and stole the cash from within Incident ref 84-s-090416

Longtown Overnight on Tuesday 5th/Wednesday 6th April, two secure and unattended company vehicles parked at the rear of a business premises in an open yard had their fuel caps unscrewed and an unknown amount of diesel was siphoned out. Both vehicles had approx 3/4 of a tank each. Incident ref 181-s-060416

<u>Speed Monitoring</u> One of the regular complaints we receive when we attend Parish Council Meetings is of speeding vehicles; we have been doing speed monitoring in several locations recently and will be doing more in other locations over the coming weeks. We will vary the days and times and we are aware that often it is first thing in the mornings, or mid afternoon that speeding is perceived as being the worst times, so we will monitor during those times too. Below is what we have been doing so far -

<u>Peterchurch</u> 12.4.16 at 2pm by police station - 40 cars monitored, 1 in excess 30mph, driver spoken to and warned. Average speed 29mph.

15.4.16 at 9.45am by Lewis Way - 50 cars monitored, 3 drivers spoken to due to speed in excess of 30mph (all of whom live in the village!) Average speed 26mph.

Westbrook, Clifford 12.4.16 at 2.45pm - 30 cars monitored, 1 driver spoken to due to speed in excess of 40mph.

<u>Ewyas Harold</u> 16.4.16 from 12 noon - 50 cars monitored, details of 9 vehicles recorded in excess of 30mph (5 of whom live in the village!) Average speed 28.7mph.

<u>Scams</u> One of our readers had a call recently from a male purporting to be from BT and claiming that someone had hacked into their computer and asking for access to it to sort it out. The male sounded quite plausible but the intended victim realised it was a scam and terminated the call. Bt have confirmed that they did not make the call.

<u>Good work!</u> On the morning of 7th April 2016 three males were seen by an off duty PCSO breaking into a property in Brockhampton, near Ross on Wye. Police attended very quickly, the males ran off in different directions but all three were caught after a short while and taken to Hereford Police Station.

After lengthy enquiries within Herefordshire, and with neighbouring forces, two brothers aged 24 & 28 and a third male aged 31, all from the Gloucester area were charged with 7 dwelling burglaries in West Mercia and Gloucester and the 24 year old male was also charged with another burglary dwelling from 2013 on Avon & Somerset.

They were also charged with various driving offences.

There are further charges to be put for offences in Gloucester, Avon & Somerset, Gwent and West Midlands and more than likely ourselves for Hereford & Worcester - they have been very busy to say the least. Kind Regards *Fiona* Golden Valley Safer Neighbourhood Team
